Appearance and Uniform Policy

Rationale/Purpose

The purpose of this guidance is to support the development of a school uniform policy, which is sensitive to the needs of children, parents and the school and reflective of cultural dress protocols within the community. The school will act fairly and reasonably, bearing in mind our duties under the Human Rights Act 1998, the Equality Act 2010 and anti-discrimination legislation.

The ethos of Northampton School is determined by many areas of school life. However, the values and expectations of the school are underpinned by the smart appearance of our students.

It is Northampton School's policy that all learners **must** wear their full uniform when attending school or when participating in a school-organised event outside normal school hours. The school will provide a complete list of items needed on the school website. This sense of belonging is encouraged from the very beginning of a student's career at the school, and we believe that wearing school uniform is an essential part of that relationship. We expect parents/carers to give their full support to the school in implementing the school policy.

We aim to be proud of our students, who are the ambassadors of the school, and we are sure that they will grow to be proud of their association with Northampton School. The policy sets out the requirements, but the Headteacher or their representative will decide on issues that are not covered by this policy or where there is an element of interpretation required. Health and safety is of paramount importance. Any breach of the Appearance and Uniform Policy will result in a sanction following the school's behaviour policy. If any student or parent has any doubt that a change in appearance, for example hairstyle, may not comply with school policy then they must ask the school for guidance before any change is made.

Northampton School reserves the right to change the uniform but would only do so in consultation with students and the parental body. Parents would be given at least a term's notice.

Aims

Our policy on uniform is based on the principles that the school uniform:

- Promotes a sense of pride in the school, in line with our ethos, values and beliefs.
- Creates a sense of 'community' and 'belonging' to the school.
- Sets an appropriate tone for behaviour and supports positive behaviour.
- Is practical, comfortable and smart.
- Identifies learners with the school and encourages identification with the school.
- Prevents learners from coming to school in fashion or 'designer' label clothes that could be distracting or create a sense of competition.
- Promotes equality in terms of appearance and helps nurture cohesion between different groups of learners.
- Is regarded as suitable for school and good value for money by most parents/carers.
- Promotes the school's care for the health and safety of its learners.

All of these aims are derived from the DfE's non-statutory guidance for schools in developing their school uniform policy.

Uniform

Northampton School's uniform is black and red. The uniform has been developed with the DfE's recent statutory guidance on the cost of school uniforms in mind and much of the uniform can be purchased from major stores.

Items that can only be purchased from the school provider are marked *.

Items that can only be purchased from the school directly are marked +.

Optional items that can be purchased from the school provider are marked #.

The following are compulsory items of school uniform:

- Black blazer
 - EITHER with a Northampton School crest badge attached (*)
 - OR by purchasing a Northampton School crest badge and attaching this separately (+)
- White school shirt (with a collar suitable for the tie)
- Northampton School tie (+)
- EITHER black trousers (tailored in a classic fit, no stretchy or jersey fabric, no skinny fit, no slim fit, no combat style)
- OR a Northampton School tartan skirt (*)
- If wearing trousers, black or dark grey socks (no white socks)
- If wearing the skirt, plain black tights or plain white or black ankle socks.
- Sensible black leather-type full shoes (should be able to polish them), flat soled or heels no higher than 3cm. These should not be trainer style, hi tops or ballet style pumps. No trainers, boots or canvas pumps, hi-tops or obviously branded shoes (e.g. Nike, Vans, Converse etc.). Appropriate shoes for working in Food Technology/Design and Technology classrooms mean these must be a full shoe that covers all of the foot rather than ballet style pumps.

The following are optional items of school uniform:

- Black V-neck jumper (Plain, no logos)
- Belts should be plain black with no studs

Physical Education Kit

The following are compulsory items of PE kit:

- Northampton School ¾ zip fleece top with logo (*)
- Northampton School polo shirt with logo (*)
- Northampton School black and red socks (*)
- Plain black shorts/skort (no branding)
- White sports socks
- Trainers - non-marking sole for indoor use
- Football boots with moulded safety studs
- Shin pads

The following are optional items of PE kit:

- Plain black tracksuit bottoms (no branding)
- Northampton School black shorts/skorts with logo (#)
- Northampton School black leggings (#)
- Gum shield (only compulsory if attending extracurricular rugby or hockey clubs)

PLEASE NOTE that it is compulsory to wear football boots with moulded safety studs on the All Weather Pitch. Trainers are not allowed to be worn on there for PE lessons.

Jewellery

As a general rule, the school does not expect children to wear jewellery.

- Students may wear **two** items of discreet jewellery and a wristwatch.
- Earrings must be studs and must be removed for PE and Dance (a pair counts as one item)
- If a ring is worn, it must be discreet and must be removed in practical lessons
- If a necklace is worn, it must be tucked into the shirt and removed in practical lessons
- If a bracelet is worn, it must be discreet and removed in practical lesson
- No other facial piercings are acceptable (including, nose, tongue, lip, cheek, eyebrow).
- If a smartwatch is worn, it must be airplane mode.
- Medic alert bracelets and necklaces may be worn and need to be visible.
- The only badges permitted are official school badges, students must wear their House badge on their blazer.
- No other jewellery is permitted.

Hair

- Hair must remain appropriate for a professional working environment, no shorter than No 2. A fade is acceptable if the hair remains to office standard and remains no shorter than a 2 on top. No shapes or lines cut in e.g. zigzags, mohican.
- Long hair (that touches shoulders) must be tied back for practical lessons.
- At all times hair must not cover an eye or eyes.
- Hair should be kept clean and tidy.
- Hair should not be dyed using unnatural colours or be styled with extensive flashes of colour.
- Hair bands used to tie hair back should be plain in nature.

Make Up and Nails

- Discreet make-up only is allowed (no bright lipstick, no eye shadow, no eye liner, no false eyelashes, no false nails)
- Clear or subtle nail varnish is allowed. Students **must not** wear nail varnish when they have Food Technology lessons.

Headwear

- In cold weather a plain scarf, hat or similar in a tasteful design may be worn to and from school but not around the school.
- Plain caps may be worn in hot weather but removed when directed on the school site.
- Sunglasses may be worn in certain circumstances determined by the school.

General Uniform

- Sweatshirts, hoodies and similar must not be worn over or under the uniform.
- Hoodies must not be worn to or from school
- The school tie should be worn at an acceptable length (where it touches the top of trousers/skirt)
- Shirts should be plain white and tucked in.
- Gloves may be worn in cold weather, but they must be taken off when inside school.
- Coats should be tasteful with no provocative logos. Coats should be removed inside the school buildings.
- School uniform in its entirety must be worn in, to and from school.
- The school advises that cyclists wear cycle helmets and high visibility jackets/bands.
